

S.E.A.L.S. SCOUTS EXCITED ABOUT LEADERSHIP SKILLS

Camp Bob Hardin: April 29 – May 1, 2016

What is it:

This Junior Leadership Training Course is for CURRENT, or soon to be leaders in your troop who are 14 and younger, with a minimum rank of Tenderfoot or above, any exceptions must be approved by the course director. Participants will be shown how to apply and use leadership skills and Scout spirit effectively in a boy lead troop in their specific leadership position. All scouts attending must be recommended by their scoutmaster.

<u>Participants are required to have completed I.L.S.T. (Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops) within</u> their home troop in the last 12 months before attending S.E.A.L.S.

A <u>mandatory scoutmaster meeting</u> is held on Friday night from 7:30 – 8:30pm.

What can you expect:

Participants will be divided into patrols of eight members. A total of 48 spots are available so you will need to register early. If registration exceeds 48, a waiting list will be created. Each patrol member will be provided with more information after registering. A website will be available shortly that will have more information about the course including what you will need to bring. Participants will have an opportunity to earn a S.E.A.L.S. strip that can be worn on their uniform. You will also receive other S.E.A.L.S. gear and have the opportunity to purchase a S.E.A.L.S. T-Shirt.

When and where: The event will be held April 29 – May 1, 2016 at Camp Bob Hardin. Check-in will begin at 6:30 p.m. on Friday, April 29th and the course will finish with a graduation ceremony starting at 10:30 a.m. on Sunday, May 1st in the dining hall.

To accommodate as many troops as possible, each Troop Scoutmaster can submit 2 youth for this course, as well as 2 alternates. If the course is not full two weeks before the course start date, then alternates will be used to fill the course. All registrations will be due no later than Friday, April 15th, 2016.

Cost: \$50.00 per participant. Includes materials, meals and S.E.A.L.S. gear

Statement of Understanding

All S.E.A.L.S. course participants are selected to represent their local troops and councils based on their qualifications in character, camping skills, physical and personal fitness, and leadership qualities. S.E.A.L.S. course participants and their parents or guardians must read this Code of Conduct and Statement of Understanding, and the Scout must agree to abide by them as a condition of participation. Ultimately, each participant must be responsible for his own behavior, and any serious misconduct or infraction of rules and regulations may result in expulsion from the S.E.A.L.S. Course.

Code of Conduct

- **1.** The Scout Oath and Law will be my guide throughout the S.E.A.L.S. course. I agree to obey the safety rules and instructions of all staff members.
- **2.** I understand that S.E.A.L.S. adult leaders are responsible for the supervision of all staff and participants, and will maintain discipline, security, safety and adherence to the S.E.A.L.S. course Code of Conduct. I understand that all S.E.A.L.S. adult leaders will abide by the Scout Oath and Law and all U.S., state and local laws.
- **3.** I will label all my personal items and leave valuable items at home. Neither S.E.A.L.S. course staff nor the BSA camp staff will be responsible for loss, breakage, or theft of personal items.
- **4.** I will set a good example by keeping myself neatly dressed and presentable in the proper S.E.A.L.S. course uniform.
- **5.** I will attend and participate in all scheduled programs and will cooperate with other S.E.A.L.S. course participants. **6.** In consideration for other participants, I agree to follow the bedtime and sleep schedule of the course.
- **7.** I will be responsible for keeping my tent and personal gear labeled, clean and neat. I will do my share to prevent littering of the BSA camp we are using.

- **8.** I will demonstrate respect for S.E.A.L.S. course and BSA camp property and be personally responsible for any loss, breakage, or vandalism of property as a result of my actions.
- **9.** I understand that the following behaviors are expressly forbidden and will be grounds for my immediate expulsion from S.E.A.L.S.:
- purchase, possession, or consumption of alcoholic beverages
- purchase, possession, or consumption of illegal drugs
- possession or use of firearms or dangerous weapons
- possession or detonation of fireworks
- theft
- intentionally threatening or injuring others
- intentionally damaging property
- **10.** I understand that serious and/or repetitive personal behavior violations, including use of tobacco, cheating, stealing, possession of lasers of any type, gambling, dishonesty, swearing, fighting, cursing, hazing or any action which fails to show respect for an individual will result in my expulsion from the S.E.A.L.S. course.
- **11.** I understand that serious violations of this code may result in expulsion from the S.E.A.L.S. course at my own expense. There are no refunds of course fees. All decisions by the Course Director are final.
